Louisiana's Parent Training & Information Center (LaPTIC) is funded through the US Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs.

LaPTIC has provided services to Louisiana families of children with disabilities, their teachers, and other professionals since 1991.

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What We Do

As your resource center, LaPTIC provides information you need to make decisions for yourself or your children with disabilities. Our center can answer questions and provide assistance for any disability, any age. We like to consider ourselves a one stop shop for information, referral, education, training and peer to peer support.

Information & Referral

LaPTIC provides information about disabilities and directs you to the resources needed for services or additional information. We have a lending library with topics ranging from education to specific health issues.

Education & Training

Workshops and trainings are coordinated and presented on topics relevant to the issues facing persons with disabilities and their families. Topics include Educational Rights, Individualized Education Plans (IEPS), Transition Planning, Early Intervention, Discipline, Behavior Rights, Home & Community Based Services, Age of Majority Planning, and more.

Peer to Peer Support

Our trained, knowledgeable staff are parents of children with disabilities or an individual with a disability. They are here to provide peer to peer support to help navigate services to fit your child's needs.

LaPTIC is a proud partner with the Louisiana State Personnel Development Grant (LaSPDG) to provide families of children with disabilities & school districts with:

- Family friendly webinars & e-learning opportunities that support families of children with disabilities in literacy at home.
- Quarterly updates of all training/workshop opportunities.
